Punctuality and Attendance

- Children can enter school between 8:40 and 8:50am and are dropped at the KS2 gate or morning door.
- Staff are on duty in the playground every morning. Reception class children are dropped off at the classroom door by their parents/carers.
- Children arriving in school between 8.50am and 9.00am should proceed straight to the office where they should be signed in by a parent.
- Children arriving after 9.00am should be signed in at the school office by a parent/carer.
- Punctuality and regular attendance are important to your child's progress in school. When absence is unavoidable, please ring the school office before 9:30am to explain your child's absence. Unexplained absences are now noted in the register as unauthorised and statistics of such must be returned to the local authority.
- Parents of children will be asked to provide medical evidence for all absence.

Absences

If your child is not well you should consult a doctor, keep him or her at home and inform the school of the reason for absence. If your child is absent, medical evidence needs to be provided to the School Attendance Officer where possible.

Holidays

Parents are informed of school holiday dates regularly on newsletters and are published on the school website www.stmichaelscatholicprimaryschool.co.uk Holidays will not be authorised during term time except in exceptional circumstances. The Governors have made the decision to have a longer break in May/June to encourage parents to access cheaper holidays. Please refer to guidance issued by Helen regarding absences.

School Meals / Snack / Breakfast

- A free healthy breakfast is currently provided every day from 8.40 - 8.50am as part of the National School Breakfast Program, subject to continued funding.
- A healthy meal is prepared by the school kitchen each day. Lunch costs £3 per day (£15 per week) and should be paid through School Gateway. Please ask the office for more information on the school gateway.
- All children in Key stage 1 are automatically entitled to a Universal free school meal. However, if parents are on certain benefits their child will be eligible to pupil premium which entitles parents to free school meals throughout their school life, should their circumstances remain unchanged. We ask that every parent claiming benefits applies for Free school meals /Pupil Premium as it benefits both the child and the school with additional funding. Please speak to the school office for guidance. We encourage every child to have a school lunch with their friends.
- St Michael's is part of the 'Healthy Schools' scheme.
- Key stage 1 children are provided with fruit free of charge every day.



Charging Policy

Parents are asked to pay on a voluntary basis to cover the cost of educational visits/Residentials.

Accidents

It is of vital importance that we have up-to-date phone numbers and details of who we can contact in the event of an emergency. Minor accidents are dealt with in school, but those of a more serious nature require us to contact you. All accidents are recorded within the School Accident Record Book.

Medication

If a child is taking medication which they need during the school day they will need to consult with Helen Leitch (Pastoral team) or the school office to fill in relevant paperwork. Wherever possible medicine dosage should be arranged so it does not interfere with the school day.

Pastoral Team

St Michael's Pastoral Team consists of Stef Lockley who is our Pastoral Lead and Helen Leitch who assists with attendance and pastoral care. Both Stef and Helen, work with families and children to overcome barriers to learning. Stef and Helen are available to discuss any issues by phone or in person through the school office and are on the playground every morning.

School Counsellor

We have a school counsellor Alice Woodward who works at school on a Wednesday. Parents can arrange a referral to the counsellor by arranging an appointment to see Stef Lockley or through their child's class teacher.

School Uniform

The Curriculum

At St Michael's Catholic Primary School, we aim to develop confident, independent learners. The National Curriculum helps us to do this effectively.

Currently the National Curriculum requires that all children between the ages of 5- and 16-years study 4 Core Subjects - English, Mathematics, ICT and Science and in primary schools the following Foundation Subjects - History, Geography, Design and Technology, Art, Music and P.E. Our current Creative Curriculum utilised across the whole school, embeds key skills in a variety of ways.

Collective Worship takes place every day. This also provides a special opportunity for the school community to meet and to consider issues which affect the whole school, covering topics as diverse as bullying, values, festivals, relationships and famous people. Parents have the right to withdraw their children from all, or part of our assemblies and the Religious Education lessons that take place in classrooms.



RED, which is our Catholic R.E Curriculum, is also taught at St Michael's and accounts for 10% of the weekly timetable.

For children in Nursery and Reception classes, work is based around the Early Learning Goals of Understanding of the World, Physical Development, Communication and Language, Personal, Social and Emotional Education, Reading, Writing and Maths

We also emphasise the importance of the Arts and P.E. in developing children's abilities and interests. During the time that children are with us, we hope that they will be involved in a range of cultural experiences; through visits to art galleries, visiting theatre companies and working with artists, writers, storytellers and performance artists.

In P.E. we aim to:

- Promote physical activity and healthy lifestyles
- Develop positive attitudes - working as part of a team to encourage fair play and sportsmanship.
- Ensure safe practice and enjoyment

Relationship and Sex Education (RSE) is taught as part of Health Education. We aim to provide children with a working knowledge of their bodies and the ability to make informed choices and decisions about their lifestyles both now and in the future. Children's questions are dealt with sensitively and honestly when they arise in the classroom. The school uses videos as starting points for discussion in Year 6. Parents are given the opportunity to see these materials each year before they are used with their children.

Please see the Head Teacher if you have any questions or concerns about this aspect of our work in school.

Assessment

Records of pupil progress and attainment are regularly updated. Evidence of pupil's work is collected and ongoing assessments, both formal and informal, of individual pupil progress are undertaken.

Annual Reports are sent out to parents towards the end of the school year along with the results of end of Key Stage national tests (SATS). Open afternoons/evenings are held in Autumn and Spring terms whereby parents may take the opportunity to visit the school, see the children's work and talk to the class teacher

Homework

All children from Reception to Year 6 classes are asked to read daily at home and parents are asked to sign their child's reading diary to confirm their child has read. Spellings and Multiplication tables are sent home on a weekly basis, and children are tested on these. The requirement to undertake homework increases as children move up the school. We would

appreciate parents' support in ensuring that the homework set is completed as this supports the work that is being done in school. Copies of the Homework Policy are available from the school office.

Special Educational Needs

If children are identified as having special needs, we support them by drawing on the expertise of our staff within school and through outside agencies. Parents are consulted at every stage of their child's individual action plan and informed of meetings with educational psychologists / learning support staff. The school has a Special Needs policy which is available to parents. The school's Local Offer for SEND is available on the school website.

Partnership

We have an open-door policy and work in partnership with Parents. Please contact the school office with any concerns or issues or suggestions.

Extended School

St Michael's offers the parents the opportunity to access both a Breakfast and After School Club. Both clubs take place on the school premises and are managed independently from the school but under the school umbrella. Breakfast club commences at 7:30am until 8:50am, when children are escorted to their classes and is charged at £4.00 per session, including breakfast. After school club runs from 3.20pm - 5:30pm (5:00pm on a Friday) and is charged at £4.00 per hour including a healthy snack. Parents must complete registration forms before children are able to access this facility. Places are booked directly on iPal, see the school office for details or the extended school tab on the school website. Telephone number will be provided on registration.

Payments must be made on booking by bank transfer
